**In-text citation:**

According to Swanson, Chamelin, Territo, & Taylor (2012), if you are bitten by a suspect seek medical attention. Swanson et al. recommend the same for needle sticks.

Needle sticks also pose a hazard (Swanson et al., 2012). Thus, caution should be taken.

“The use of latex or nitrile gloves significantly reduces exposure from body fluids and may reduce the amount of blood transferred by needle sticks” (Swanson et al., 2012, p. 65).

When using a polilight, a crime scene technician should also wear goggles of a complementary color (Montreal Science Centre, 2004).
