

## WELCOME TO IRREGULAR VERB DRILLS

You will hear the principal parts of a verb, for example the verb "to be".

Listen and repeat after me.

	Am, is, are	was, were	been
<u>Repeat:</u>	am, is, are	was, were	been

Then you will hear and repeat a sentence using the verb in the **Simple Present** Tense, with a modal (Modal Auxiliary), or in the infinitive form:

	I am a student at Miami-Dade Community College (M-DCC).
<u>Repeat:</u>	I am a student at M-DCC.

	He may be a student at M-DCC.
<u>Repeat:</u>	He may be a student at M-DCC.

	He wants to be a student at Miami-Dade.
<u>Repeat:</u>	He wants to be a student at Miami-Dade.

Next, the **Simple Past** Tense:

	I was a good student in my country.
<u>Repeat:</u>	I was a good student in my country.

Finally, the **Present Perfect** Tense:

	I have been a student at Miami Dade since 1990.
<u>Repeat:</u>	I have been a student at Miami Dade since 1992.

A male and a female voice will present the material alternately. Let's begin!
